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COMPOSITION OF ACTTBA CHAMPIONSHIPS

CHAMPIONSHIPS EVENT

The Championship is a graded scratch pinfall event held over a three (3) game series and comprised of the following squads:

- Singles (S)
- Doubles (D)
- Trios (T)

Highest three (3) game series to win each grade in each case.

- All Events (a combination of any singles, doubles and trios event)

An All Events Champion will be declared for every Grade. A bowler's best appearance in Trios, Doubles and Singles shall count towards their All Events score, regardless of the Grade in which the events are bowled. Only one paid All Events entry will be accepted from each competitor. Mixed doubles and Mixed trios scores will count towards All Events entries

MASTERS EVENTS

The Masters events include the Youth Open Masters, Disabilities Open Masters and the Adult Open Masters and are a total scratch pinfall event played over 7 games.

Qualifying for a Masters event will be based on the highest Singles or Doubles scratch series bowled in the championships where payment of the Qualification Attempt fee has been paid prior to commencement of the squad.

Bowlers may participate in multiple Masters events and where they are contested at the same time will be able to use 1 set of scores in both divisions. If a bowler progresses to the next stage (where applicable) in multiple events at the same time they will be required to nominate the final they would like to participate in. The payment amount for multiple Masters events will be at the discretion of the Tournament Committee.

CUP EVENTS

The Cup events include the Junior Restricted Cup, Disabilities Classic Cup, Disabilities Restricted Cup, Seniors Cup and the Adult Restricted Cup and are a total handicap pinfall event played over 7 games.

Qualifying for a Cup event will be based on the highest Singles or Doubles handicap series bowled in the championships where payment of the Qualification Attempt fee has been paid prior to commencement of the squad.

REGISTRATION and ELIGIBILITY CRITERIA

CHAMPIONSHIP EVENT

These championships are open to all currently registered 2020 TBA members in good standing. All bowlers must present their current year Registered Players Card of proof of payment for inspection by the Tournament Officials prior to competing in their first scheduled event.

MASTERS AND CUP EVENTS

To be eligible to bowl in any of these events the bowler must have qualified and completed an All Events entry in the Championships prior to the advised check in time for the event. An All Events will consist of a Singles, a Doubles and a Trios event.

BOWLERS WITH A DISABILITY

A bowler with a disability is defined as a person who suffers from a condition that has limitation, restriction or impairment that restricts everyday activity. The condition is permanent. It should be noted that degree or degrees of pain are not considered a disability.

To prove a disability, a participant needs to provide one of the following types of evidence:

- Valid Disability Support Pension Card (DSP).
- Recipient of the Child Disability Allowance.
- Classification Card issued by Tenpin Bowling Australia, Deaf Sports Australia, Blind Sports Australia, Wheelchair Sports Australia or AUSRAPID (or state affiliated organisation).
- Letter from a medical or educational professional:
 - Physiotherapist or Occupational Therapist.
 - Principal of Primary, Secondary or Tertiary Education Organisation.
 - Psychologist.
 - General Medical Practitioner.
 - Audiologist.
 - Ophthalmologist.
- Visual evidence in the case of short statured or participants that are amputees. An amputation is required at the site of a major joint. For example, the loss of a foot or both feet, an arm or both arms.

All TBA affiliated Associations and State Committees are required to adhere to this definition for the purposes of Disability State Championships and selection of State Teams

RULES, REGULATIONS and GENERAL INFORMATION

1. RULES AND REGULATIONS

All TBA Rules and regulations will apply to this Event.

2. CLOSING DATE FOR ENTRIES

Lane allocation is restricted and entries will be processed in the order they are received, there will be no closing date for entries. Entries will be accepted up to the start of the last scheduled squad subject to lane availability.

3. ENTERING AVERAGES

Each bowler must use their highest league average ending the year of 2019 where a minimum of 18 games have been bowled.

4. BOWLERS WITHOUT AN AVERAGE

Bowlers may apply to the Tournament Committee for classification prior to submitting an entry. If no such application is received, an average will be determined by the Tournament Committee.

5. AVERAGE REVIEW

The Tournament Director reserves the right to review the average and re grade any bowler prior to that bowler participating in the event. Participation using an intentionally incorrect average may result in disqualification.

6. GRADING

All entries will be graded based in this document using the entering averages supplied.

7. ATTIRE

All Bowlers are required to wear a collared shirt or bowling industry shirt. Men to wear slacks or dress shorts; ladies to wear skirt, slacks, skorts or dress shorts. No Jeans, tracksuit pants, tank tops, hats, torn clothing or shirts with offensive wording or inappropriate images that may offend others will be permitted.

8. SQUADS

A squad will consist of registered bowlers in either a Single, Doubles or Trios Event entry and held at the defined time according to the schedule.



9. CHECK IN

Bowlers are required to check in fifteen (15) minutes prior to the designated check in time for their squad, any queries or protests must be lodged at this time.

10. DISPUTES

Any protests, disputes or complaints arising during the Event must be lodged with the Tournament Director within fifteen (15) minutes of the alleged infringement and confirmed in writing within forty-eight (48) hours. Disputes will be adjudicated by the Tournament Director, and at least one other available ACT Tenpin Bowling Association member. Their decision will be final.

11. ABSENTEES

Any bowler not checked in fifteen (15) minutes prior to squad time according to the clock in the centre will forfeit that squad, unless a valid reason can be provided.

Validity of the reason will be determined by the Tournament Director and at least one other available ACT Tenpin Bowling Association member.

12. REPLACEMENT

All replacements or changes in the original schedule are required to be reported to the Tournament Director at least thirty (30) minutes before the scheduled commencement of the Squad.

13. TARDY BOWLERS

There will be no allowance for Tardy Bowlers, all bowlers must be checked in 15 minutes prior to starting squad times. They will forfeit all squads missed.

14. PLAYERS AREA

For this Event the designated players' area will be for participating bowlers only. The designated players' area shall be confirmed prior to the commencement of each day's play.

15. MOBILE DEVICES

Mobile devices and personal entertainment systems (phones, tablets, laptops, computers, mp3, iPods, etc) will not be allowed in the players' area. The use of 'apps' in the players' area will not be permitted.

16. SMOKING

Smoking by competitors is prohibited from the commencement of warm-up through to the completion of the squad play on each day of the Event.

17. ALCOHOL

A total ban will be enforced on alcohol consumption during each day's play for the Event.

18. ASADA (Australian Sports Anti-Doping Authority)

All bowlers should be aware of, and will be subjected to, all ASADA policies, guidelines and penalties.

19. REFUNDS

Individuals shall be entitled to a refund after the entry form and entry fees have been received. There are no refunds for optional Masters / Cup Qualification Attempts.

20. SQUAD AND LANE ALLOCATION

Individual squad allocation will be confirmed and provided via email at least 2 days prior to Event commencing subject to full payment being received for individual, doubles and trios registration.

Lane allocation will be confirmed and provided during check in.

21. ALL EVENTS

An All Events Champion will be declared for every Grade. A bowler's best appearance in Trios, Doubles and Singles shall count towards their All Events score, regardless of the Grade in which the events are bowled. Only one paid All Events entry will be accepted from each competitor. Mixed doubles and Mixed trios scores will count towards All Events entries

22. ACT STATE REPRESENTATIVE TEAM

Any member of the current ACT Walter Rachuig Team, ACT Seniors Team, ACT Restricted Team, ACT Youth Team, ACT Presidents Shield Team, ACT Disabilities Open Team, ACT Cole Cup Team or anyone intending to nominate for those teams in the following year, will be required to complete an All Events entry in this ACT Tenpin Bowling Championship. Also note that performance at these championships could form part of the selection criteria for State Team Selection

23. SPECIAL NOTE

The Tournament Committee will decide any matters that may arise and are not covered in the Tournament conditions.

CODE OF CONDUCT

This Code applies to all events and tournaments conducted by the ACT Tenpin Bowling Association and govern all bowlers participating in such events. This Code will be applied in conjunction with any applicable Rules or Regulations as set forth by the ACT Tenpin Bowling Association or the governing body. All persons involved in any event covered by this Code are always to conduct themselves in sportsperson like manner, Un-sportsperson like conduct will not be tolerated and may lead to the bowler/bowlers being disqualified. This applies to participants, officials, spectators, volunteers and any other persons as may be involved.

COACHING

Coaching is permitted at all times however Coaches must not move into the player's area or hold up play. Coaches may stand directly behind the player's area for bowlers to approach them or be called to them, but this must not take up time that will interrupt play. The player could be disqualified if this happens.

FOOD AND DRINK

Food and drink is not permitted in the players' area at any time. Players may leave the area to consume food or drink provided they do not hold up play.

ZERO TOLERANCE FOR ABUSIVE BEHAVIOUR

All persons must, at all times, respect the rights, dignity and worth of every human being. Verbal, physical, or emotional abuse of any other person will not be tolerated and will result in immediate disqualification for the offender. A full report will be made and further disciplinary action may be taken if appropriate.

CARD SYSTEM

All events covered under this Code will have a penalty card system to assist in managing and implementing the code. Officials may impose penalties under this system at any time during an event, and in serious cases such penalty may directly result in further disciplinary action without warning. Persons committing any infraction under the Rules or Regulations of the specific event will be subject to this system, this may include but is not limited to other regulations such as the Anti-Doping Policy and Code of Ethics. For minor and infrequent infractions, an offender will be warned and instructed on correct behavior. For repeated infractions or those of a more serious nature, a Yellow Card will be issued to the offender. For serious infractions, a Red Card will be issued. Serious infractions may include, but not limited to, violating a Zero-Tolerance policy, Violent Conduct, or receiving a Second Yellow Card during the event. For events such as representative duties, "the event" will include the entire time a person is in the care or accommodations of an ACT Tenpin Bowling Association representative.

CONSEQUENCES OF A RED CARD

The consequences of a Red Card vary with the persons involvement;

1. For a competitor: Disqualification for the remainder of the Tournament, and a possible suspension from future competitions. The Tournament committee must convene at a convenient time within 24 hours to discuss the need for further action to be taken.
2. For an Office Bearer: Immediate suspension from the position held. The Organisational Body that the office is associated with must convene a hearing as soon as possible following the infraction to investigate the infraction and discuss the need of further action to be taken.
3. For a Team Official (Coach, Manager, etc.): Immediate suspension from the position held. The Organisational Body that the official is associated with must convene a hearing as soon as possible following the infraction to investigate and discuss the need for further action to be taken.
4. For a Registered Bowler not involved in the event: The Association/Registered bowling centre that the person is Registered with will be advised of the infraction and they must convene a hearing as soon as possible following that advice to investigate the infraction and discuss the need for further action to be taken.
5. For a non TBA person: Centre Management and/or Tournament Officials should ask the offenders to leave the location. If the person refuses, put the matter into the hands of the Police and ask them to remove the offender.

In each of the above cases, a detailed report is to be submitted to the ACT Tenpin Bowling Association who may choose to further investigate and impose any further penalty it deems necessary in addition to the penalty imposed at the time.

In addition, a detailed report will be submitted by the ACT Tenpin Bowling Association to Tenpin Bowling Australia, who may also choose to further investigate and impose further penalties as it deems necessary in addition to those already imposed at the time and by the ACT Tenpin Bowling Association.

Whilst all persons involved in the Association and its activities are required to abide by this Code, members of the ACT Representative teams are required to sign their acceptance of this Code and make a conscious commitment to honouring it. In the case of juniors, a legal guardian will also sign that they accept their child is bound by this Code.



MASTERS and CUP ACT NATIONAL REPRESENTATIVES

The following criteria will determine the ACT representatives and eligibility for payment into 2020 National events. At the time of these championships, in order to be awarded the ACT representative position, Adult and Senior bowlers must currently reside in the Canberra, Queanbeyan and Goulburn region. Junior bowlers and bowlers with a Disability must currently reside in the Canberra, Queanbeyan, Goulburn, Wagga Wagga and Griffith region. This residency determination will be at the discretion of the tournament Director. Also, performance at these events could form part of the selection criteria for National Squad selection.

NATIONAL YOUTH OPEN MASTERS REPRESENTATIVES

Will be provided to the highest male and female bowlers from the 2020 ACT Youth Masters who meet ACT residency requirements and have not reached the age of 21 years on 1st January 2020. Paid entry will apply only if the representative has won a division of the 2020 ACT Youth Masters. If the representative is unable to attend the event, the 2nd highest eligible bowler will be awarded the spot but will not receive a paid entry.

NATIONAL DISABILITIES OPEN MASTERS, CLASSIC AND RESTRICTED CUP REPRESENTATIVES

Will be provided to the highest finishing bowlers from the 2020 ACT Disabilities Open Masters, 2020 ACT Disabilities Classic Cup and 2020 ACT Disabilities Restricted Cup and who meet ACT residency requirements. Paid entry will apply only if the representative has won their respective event. If the representative is unable to attend the event or becomes ineligible, 2nd place will be awarded the spot but will not receive a paid entry.

NATIONAL RESTRICTED CUP REPRESENTATIVES

Will be provided to the highest male and female bowlers from the 2020 ACT Restricted Cup who meet ACT residency requirements. Paid entry will apply only if the representative has won a division of the 2020 ACT Restricted Cup. If the representative is unable to attend the event or becomes ineligible, 2nd place will be awarded the spot but will not receive a paid entry.

NATIONAL SENIORS CUP REPRESENTATIVES

Paid entry will be provided to the winners of the male and female divisions in the 2020 ACT Seniors Cup who meet ACT residency requirements. Paid entry will apply only if the representative has won a division of the 2020 ACT Seniors Cup. If the representative is unable to attend the event, 2nd place will be awarded the spot but will not receive a paid entry.

AUSTRALIAN OPEN MASTERS REPRESENTATIVES

Paid entry will be provided to the winners of the male and female divisions in the 2020 ACT Open Masters who meet ACT residency requirements. Paid entry will apply only if the representative has won a division of the 2020 Open Masters. If the representative is unable to attend the event, 2nd place will be awarded the spot but will not receive a paid entry.



ACT YOUTH OPEN MASTERS

1. A minimum of four (4) qualifiers is required to hold this event
2. The ACT Youth Open Masters shall be conducted in two Divisions - Men's and Women's.
3. If insufficient entries are received, the ACT Youth Open Masters shall be conducted in only one combined division.
4. Entry is open to all TBA registered players who have not reached the age of 21 years on 1st January 2020. Participants must have completed an All Events entry prior to the check in time advised below in the current ACT Championships, held in conjunction with this tournament.
5. ALL TBA RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL APPLY TO THIS TOURNAMENT. Any occurrence not covered by these rules will be determined by the Tournament Committee.
6. Bowlers shall qualify for the Finals by bowling 3 games with Total scratch pinfall to decide qualifying positions.
7. In the event of a tie on pinfall for qualifying scores, the highest third game score shall decide the higher position. If a tie still exists, the second game score shall be used, etc.
8. Finalists shall be the top 5 boys and top 5 girls qualifying over a 3-game scratch pinfall series plus the defending champions. Should there be no defending champion/s the top 6 qualifiers shall be used in each division.
 - a. The minimum number of finalists in each division is 4. Fewer finalists shall result in the event being cancelled and all qualifying attempts refunded.
 - b. The number of finalists may be increased in the event of unexpectedly high qualifying attempts for this event.
9. The cost of qualifying shall be \$15.00/cup qualification attempt; the highest singles or doubles series paid attempt bowled in the championships will be used to qualify.
10. The Finals shall consist of 7 games. Total pinfall will determine the overall winners. No qualifying pinfall will carry into the finals.
 - a. The format may be varied to match the number of finalists competing, whilst staying as close as is practical to the original format.
11. In the event of a tie for 1st after all the games are completed a single game will be played to break the tie. Scratch pinfall will decide the winner. Any subsequent tie will require a 9th and 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken.
12. CHECK-IN - All finalists are required to check-in with the Tournament Committee by 12.30pm Sunday 29th March 2020.
13. ANY FINALIST WHO HAS NOT CHECKED IN BY THE APPOINTED TIME SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED, AND THE NEXT HIGHEST QUALIFIER WILL BE INVITED TO BOWL IN THE FINAL.
14. The prizes in both divisions are:

1st Place **\$130.00 guaranteed plus a shirt. Paid entry into the current years' National Junior Open Masters Final*, Paid entry into the next ACT Youth Open Masters Final.** If no event is held, no representative spots will be awarded.

Further places Based upon numbers of entries received

These prizes are guaranteed minimum prizes. Should higher than expected qualifying entries be received in either Division, the Tournament Committee may, at its discretion, increase the prize money in that Division

ACT DISABILITIES RESTRICTED CUP

1. A minimum of four (4) qualifiers is required to hold this event
2. The ACT Disabilities Restricted Cup shall be conducted in one division for men and women (including Junior bowlers).
3. Entry is open to all TBA registered players who have a disability. Participants must have completed an All Events entry prior to the check in time advised below in the current ACT Championships, held in conjunction with this tournament AND meet the eligibility requirements below.
4. ELIGIBILITY- Entry is restricted to bowlers averaging 119 or less, using the same entering average as the current ACT Championships, held in conjunction with this tournament.
5. ALL TBA RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL APPLY TO THIS TOURNAMENT. Any occurrence not covered by these rules will be determined by the Tournament Committee.
6. Bowlers shall qualify for the Finals by bowling 3 games with Total handicap pinfall to decide qualifying positions (Handicap based on 100% of 200).
7. In the event of a tie on pinfall, the highest third game score shall decide the higher position. If a tie still exists, the second game score shall be used, etc.
8. Finalists shall be the top 7 qualifying over a 3-game handicap pinfall series plus the defending champions. Should there be no defending champion top 8 qualifiers shall be used.
 - a. The minimum number of finalists is 4. Fewer finalists shall result in the event being cancelled and all qualifying attempts refunded.
 - b. The number of finalists may be increased in the event of unexpectedly high qualifying attempts for this event.
9. The cost of qualifying shall be \$15.00/cup qualification attempt; the highest singles or doubles series paid attempt bowled in the championships will be used to qualify.
10. The Finals shall consist of 7 games. Total handicap pinfall will determine the overall winners. No qualifying pinfall will carry into the finals.
 - a. The format may be varied to match the number of finalists competing, whilst staying as close as is practical to the original format.
11. In the event of a tie for 1st after all the games are completed a single game will be played to break the tie. Pinfall plus handicap will decide the winner. Any subsequent tie will require a 9th and 10th frame playoff until the tie is broken, using 1/5th of the bowlers’ entering handicaps rounded down to the nearest whole number.
12. CHECK-IN - All finalists are required to check-in with the Tournament Committee by 8.45am Sunday 29th March 2020.
13. ANY FINALIST WHO HAS NOT CHECKED IN BY THE APPOINTED TIME SHALL BE DISQUALIFIED, AND THE NEXT HIGHEST QUALIFIER WILL BE INVITED TO BOWL IN THE FINAL.
14. The prizes in both divisions are:

1st Place **\$110.00 guaranteed plus a shirt. Paid entry into the current years’ National Disabilities Restricted Cup Final*, Paid entry into the next ACT Disabilities Restricted Cup Final (dependent upon eligibility).** If no event is held, no representative spots will be awarded.

Further places Based upon numbers of entries received

These prizes are guaranteed minimum prizes. Should higher than expected qualifying entries be received, the Tournament Committee may, at its discretion, increase the prize money.

ACT DISABILITIES CLASSIC CUP

1. A minimum of four (4) qualifiers is required to hold this event
2. The ACT Disabilities Classic Cup shall be conducted in one division for men and women (including Junior bowlers).
3. Entry is open to all TBA registered players who have a disability. Participants must have completed an All Events entry prior to the check in time advised below in the current ACT Championships, held in conjunction with this tournament AND meet the eligibility requirements below.
4. ELIGIBILITY- Entry is restricted to bowlers averaging 120 to 159, using the same entering average as the current ACT Championships, held in conjunction with this tournament.
5. ALL TBA RULES AND REGULATIONS WILL APPLY TO THIS TOURNAMENT. Any occurrence not covered by these rules will be determined by the Tournament Committee.
6. Bowlers shall qualify for the Finals by bowling 3 games with Total handicap pinfall to decide qualifying positions (Handicap based on 100% of 200).
7. In the event of a tie on pinfall, the highest third game score shall decide the higher position. If a tie still exists, the second game score shall be used, etc.
8. Finalists shall be the top 7 qualifying over a 3-game handicap pinfall series plus the defending champions. Should there be no defending champion top 8 qualifiers shall be used.
 - a. The minimum number of finalists is 4. Fewer finalists shall result in the event being cancelled and all qualifying attempts refunded.
 - b. The number of finalists may be increased in the event of unexpectedly high qualifying attempts for this event.
9. The cost of qualifying shall be \$15.00/cup qualification attempt; the highest singles or doubles series paid attempt bowled in the championships will be used to qualify.
10. The Finals shall consist of 7 games. Total handicap pinfall will determine the overall winners. No qualifying pinfall will carry into the finals.
 - a. The format may be varied to match the number of finalists competing, whilst staying as close as is practical to the original format.
11. In the event of a tie for 1st after all the games are completed a single game will be played to break the tie. Pinfall plus handicap will decide the winner. ACT DISABILITIES OPEN MASTERS

1. A minimum of four (4) qualifiers is required to hold this event
2. The ACT Disabilities Open Masters shall be conducted in one division for men and women (including Junior bowlers).
